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BRASSAI

An exhibition circulated under the auspices of The International Council of The Museum of Modern Art, New York.

A collection of 71 photographs selected by John Szarkowski, Director of the Museum's Department of Photography, from work executed by Brassai between 1932 and 1958. Brassai was born in Transylvania, Romania in 1899, but has lived in Paris since 1923. In the main, this exhibition illustrates his primary fascination with life in the streets and cafés of his adopted home. Of outstanding documentary interest are the portraits of his fellow artists Bonnard, Dali, Giacometti, Picasso and Richier and the writers Genet and Miller. In their simple compact characterizations, Brassai's photographs seem to assume the very essence of the subjects which they portray.

COSTS:

 - a. Up to 12 35 mm color transparencies illustrating the installation with visitors present
 - b. 6 black-and-white 8x10 inch installation photographs
