


Save Life on Earth is a collaborative effort by over 150 artists. They have transcended political and cultural differences to affirm life on a planet threatened by nuclear annihilation. The joint participation of artists from the United States, the Soviet Union, the People's Republic of China and eighteen other countries is unprecedented.

The challenge confronting the Boston artists who organized this exhibition was to stir the feelings of a public already bombarded and desensitized by images of nuclear horror. With that in mind, the organizers planned an exhibition which they hoped would contain works of discovery and affirmation of all aspects of endangered life.

A universal design — a green background with an open circle and the words "Save Life on Earth" was silkscreened in one of seven languages. Prominent painters, sculptors, graphic designers, cartoonists and printmakers on five continents were invited to complete the basic design.

The result is a collection of individual works of remarkable variety which use, depart from or even transform the original format. The dominant images of life and hope coexist with those of death and despair.

The exhibition opened in Budapest in June, 1985, in conjuction with the fifth congress of International Physicians for the Prevention of Nuclear War. The show's tour of Europe and Asia continued in Moscow and at the United Nations Palais des Nations in Geneva. After its conclusion in Fall 1986 the North American tour will begin.

One full-size reproduction in each of the exhibit's major languages will be available for purchase. In addition, a book will be published in mid-1986, which also features original literary contributions by the following distinguished writers:
